ANTON ART CENTER TO HOST NEW EXHIBIT OF SHAPED PAINTINGS BY MICHAEL ROSS

Mount Clemens, Mich. – The center's first floor gallery will feature *A History of Dreams: Paintings and Objects by Michael Ross,* an exhibit of nearly fifty original shaped paintings, panels, and three-dimensional objects ranging in size from small to large, including diptychs, triptychs, and cubes. The borders of the compositions are designed to reflect, complement, and enhance the artwork's content.

Michael is an artist, muralist, and curator working out of 333 Midland Studios and the Annex Gallery in Highland Park since 2014. His work combines shaped surfaces with painted gradients, patterns, shapes, and color. He cites the Indian classical music form of 'Raga' as inspiration through its "defined framework and interior improvisation that speaks to both the present moment and the eternal". Ross graduated from Oakland University in 2003, majoring in Anthropology and a minor in Studio Art.

About his body of work, Michael shares, "I like to think of my work as representing a few different realities: the one which exists in the 'real' world and the ones you find in your dreams. In either case, that reality is often beautiful and/or convoluted, and always weird. I'm interested in how a two-dimensional painting can occupy a more sculptural space and cut into the third dimension." While exploring these ideas, he says, the paintings have developed into shaped, multi-piece forms combining sharp angles with contrasting curves.

Michael's paintings feature repetition of a variety of color gradients and shapes that may also include recognizable content, such as landscape, figure, or portrait. Michael continues, "As I paint, I allow the piece to evolve into the form it takes. The combination of mannered patterns with improvisation gives a sense of peace, calm, and overall well-being for me. I incorporate a sense of the space I am in, creating in a sense of 'belonging' to that space."

Applying paint in thick strokes and crafting uncommonly shaped canvases calls attention to the adaptability of the act of painting. Michael adds, "In my latest series, I'm highlighting the beauty of the medium and its plane—'paint for paint's sake'. This emphasizes the multitude of ways in which it can be perceived through its manipulation by the artist and by what the viewer brings to the experience of viewing art. I'm striving for a 'pure' art experience, both for myself and the viewer."


